CAR SEAT SAFETY

BUYING THE RIGHT CAR SEAT

Your baby needs to ride in a rear-facing car seat as long as possible until 2 or more years. When your child has outgrown that seat, you are ready for a forward-facing car seat.

INSTALLING YOUR CAR SEAT


You'll need to decide on using either the seat belt or lower anchors to secure your car seat. Both are safe, but don't use them both at the same time. Once your child is forward facing, it is important to use the tether with the seat belt or lower anchors.

GETTING THE RIGHT FIT

A properly fitted harness gives the best possible protection for your child. Always ensure the chest clip is placed on chest at armpit level and ensure the straps are tight enough so there is no slack to pinch in the strap.

WHEN TO CHANGE YOUR CAR SEAT

Look on the car seat label to make sure your child is still within the weight, height and age limits per manufacturer guidelines.



Three out of four car seats are not used or installed correctly

INFANTS/TODDLERS: Rear facing car seat until 2 years of age or until they reach highest height & weight per manufacturer guidelines

(Birth to 22-35 pounds)

TODDLERS/PRE-SCHOOLERS: After a child outgrows a rear facing seat a forward-facing car seat with a harness should be used for as long as possible (until child reaches height and weight limit per manufacturer) Forward –Facing-Only Seats (20-80 pounds)

SCHOOL-AGERS: All children who exceed the limit for forward facing car seats should use a belt positioning booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits properly, typically when they have reached 4 ft. 9" and are between ages 8-12.



Never seat a child in front of the airbag

Children who have outgrown safety seats and are using seatbelts should remain in the back seat through age 12

Seat children in the middle of the back seat
Use proper restraints for every trip
Set a good example, always wear a seatbelt
